The pride and appreciation the group holds for its many volunteers is clear in the group's voices when they speak about what has been accomplished in two short months.

The 57,600 meals equated to eight pallets of boxes headed to people in need across the globe and here at home in the United States. Rogan Einspahr with Wauneta Roller Mills donated his time and forklift to move the food on and off the truck.

Volunteers make packages consisting of a mixture of rice, dried vegetables, soy mix and chicken flavoring. The soy mix gives the meals protein and the chicken flavoring is enriched with vitamins and nutrients.

The organization also received a new shipment of these ingredients on Wednesday, enough to package another 60,000 or more meals.

Their last shipment included some overflow, allowing them to package a total of 60,600 meals to date.

### **Recent fundraiser**

The group hosted a bake sale and silent auction fundraiser last Saturday, Dec. 15 and received overwhelming support from the community at the event.

They received over \$3,700 from the silent auction, bake sale and donations and an additional donation of \$944 from Thrivent Financial for Lutherans.
