The company opened a shop at 119 South Arapahoe. The phone number at the shop is 308-394-5313.

Wauneta native Tanner Kerchal will serve as the manager of Wauneta operations for the company.

Beckner said, "I felt it was important to hire someone local and add jobs to the community." He hopes to hire 2-3 more employees for the Wauneta location in the future as the business takes off.

Wellstone Industries has been operating in Wray for over 40 years and was purchased by Beckner in 2010. The company drills, services and installs domestic and stock wells. It also installs trench water lines and water systems.

They are fully licensed in Nebraska for water well drilling and service.

The company's initial focus in Wauneta will be service and drilling, however Beckner plans to offer the full gamut of Wellstone's services including excavation in the future, hopefully within a year.

The company is also interested in completion of large projects in the Wauneta area and can bring crews and equipment from their Colorado location to complete them.

When asked what attracted him to Wauneta Beckner said initially the area was strategically interesting to them, but that Wauneta also has a similar customer base to those Wellstone already serves and that the Wauneta Economic Development Committee was very welcoming and willing to help the business expand to Wauneta.

Becker said, "From visiting Wauneta I could tell it was the type of community that is interested in staying and trying to grow—that's appealing to any new business."
